## Community

Seoul Christian School, is dedicated to "perfecting of the saints for the work of the ministry." (Eph. 4:12) The school is a ministry of Korea Gospel Fellowship Association and shares the same facilities. The school was founded in 1998 with an enrollment of 3 in elementary and 2 in middle school. The school currently enrolls 120 students in kindergarten through twelfth grade. The school is administered by a member of the board of Korea Gospel Fellowship Association. The school administrator is a missionary under Gospel Fellowship Association, Suite 110, 1809 Wade Hampton Blvd., Greenville, SC, 29609. All faculty and staff are required to be members of the Seoul Bible Church.

## School Characteristics

Seoul Christian School is located in Seoul, the capitol city of the Republic of South Korea.

## Faculty

All faculty have four-year college degrees and all are graduates of a fundamental Christian college. All faculty members meet or exceed the minimum requirements for certification by the American Association of Christian Schools and Colleges.

## Explanation of Transcripts

Grade Point Average (GPA) is determined by assigning a numerical equivalent to each semester grade. The equivalents are A = 4, B = 3, C = 2, D = 1, F = 0. The average of these equivalents is the GPA. Every semester grade is given equal standing, regardless of the number of times per week the class met or the amount of credit earned. Rank in Class (RIC) is determined by a comparison of the GPA for each graduating senior beginning with his freshman year.

## Course Characteristics

Classes meet for 18 weeks during the semester or 36 weeks per year. Each class that is assigned a yearly credit of 1 unit meets for 55 minutes, 5 days per week. One unit of credit represents two successfully completed

semesters; half units are granted for one successful semester.

A unit of Bible is required each year that a student attends Seoul Christian School.

## Levels of Preparation

**Noncollege Preparatory:** Noncollege preparatory students must have a minimum of twenty units of high school credits to graduate. Students must exhibit an acceptable ability in math and English on a national achievement test; otherwise, the student must take a course in consumer math for a math deficiency and remedial English for an English deficiency.

**College Preparatory:** A student in the college preparatory program must take geometry, speech and two years of the same foreign language. He must have a 2.00 GPA on all high school work. He must have 24 units to graduate.

**Honors Program:** The honors program is the highest level of preparation available from Seoul Christian School. In addition to the required courses, the honors students must take the following:

- Math through AP-calculus
- Creative Writing
- Additional unit of Science  
(AP Biology, Chemistry or Physics)
- Additional units of Social Studies
- Two years of the same foreign language

The honors program requires the student to complete twenty-four units of high school work and maintain a 3.0 GPA. No more than one *D* semester grade will be allowed; however, no student can remain in the program who makes an *F* semester grade.
